

Ethical Issues associated with Mental Health



i. Overcoming stigma

- "Whoever suffers from mental illness 'always' bears God's image and likeness in himself [or herself], as does every human being. In addition, he [or she] 'always' has the inalienable right not only to be considered as an image of God... but also to be treated as such..." (John Paul II, 16 January 1997)

iv. Compulsory Assessment and Treatment

- sometimes necessary
- last resort
- rights of patients must be respected
- getting the balance right is not easy

v. Participation

- the goal cannot be only that people are no longer unwell
- the goal must be that people are truly alive, participating in:
 - meaningful work (voluntary or paid)
 - economic life
 - social life
 - cultural and political life
